## Random Objects from Direct Observations Drawing


- This assignment is for March 26<sup>th</sup>- April 3rd of our extended school cancellation. You will draw one additional item per day.


## DO FIRST--Video Instruction

Draw one new item for each day of missed school (starting on Thurs March 26th)




Draw items from direct observation! Not from a photo and not from your memory or imagination.




Use pencil first. You may then trace over with marker or pen if you would like.



Try to use plain white paper. However, if you absolutely must use lined paper you will not loose points.




You can overlap items to make more items fit on your paper. You may also start a new piece of paper or draw on the back if you run out of room.



Your grade will be based on overall effort shown.

Adding shading to your objects is optional but does show more effort.



Overall complexity of objects drawn will also be taken into consideration towards the amount of effort you put forth. All examples shown in this slide show demonstrate an acceptable level of effort for this assignment.
